

Our emphasized mission rotations laundry detergent, dryer sheets, and trash bags in this year are Upshur Parish House and Heart and our cleaning baskets. Hygiene items are individually Hand House.

This month we will be collecting for the Heart and Hand House in Philippi, WV. Heart and Hand House is a non-profit mission project that exists because of the clear Christian mandate to minister to the physical, mental, spiritual and emotional needs of in-crisis, low-income people of Barbour County, WV. Their ministry programs include a food pantry; a home repair and construction program; assistance with utilities, rent, and certain medical

expenses; providing layettes for newborn babies; and a backpack feeding program for local school children. They also operate two thrift stores and The Market Place, home of the Community Garden Market.




