SERMON SERIES: Today: Owner of a Broken Heart

Using Peter's denial of Jesus on the night He was arrested, this message leads us to understand how we might forgive ourselves for some of the awful things **we** do!

One of the barriers to forgiving our self is the insecurity we may feel about ourselves. We may believe that we deserve to be punished, completely misunderstanding the idea of grace and mercy.

Week 6: "A Total Eclipse of God"

This message helps us understand what we need to do with anger we may have toward God. There are times when we feel life has treated us unfairly, and we are angry at God. We can come to a dead-end in our spiritual life with anger or hatred toward God.

Are we to forgive Him? What are we to do with this anger?

Week 7: Forgiveness: The Heart of Revolution
